Denver Public Schools to Expand AVID College Readiness System with \$984,000 Grant from I.A. O'Shaughnessy Foundation

Denver, CO (January 15, 2015): AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination), a San Diego-based non-profit, proven college readiness system, and Denver Public Schools (DPS) jointly announced the start of the AVID Denver Neighborhood Project, a 3-year grant funded by the I.A. O'Shaughnessy Foundation to expand and strengthen the AVID College Readiness System in a cluster of schools in two underrepresented neighborhoods served by DPS. With proven outcomes and published data as support, AVID practices in complex urban locations nationally. In this project, AVID will apply the full breadth of its System in Denver Public Schools.

“The purpose of our granting initiative is to support projects such as AVID, that have a measurable and meaningful impact on improving educational outcomes for at-risk students, and can be replicated in other communities” commented John O'Shaughnessy, President of the O'Shaughnessy Foundation based in Minnesota. “We are excited to support AVID's work in Denver because we have seen AVID programs help improve education so that students are able to create real success in their lives.”

AVID District Director for the Denver Public Schools, Gary Cooper stressed, “We are committed to developing strong educational options for students and parents in every neighborhood within DPS.” In a school district that advocates school choice, which allows families to choose where their child attends school, this project is designed to create natural feeder patterns of schools with positive college-going cultures and AVID academic and social supports for low-income, disadvantaged students.

AVID is recognized nationally for accelerating the performance of underrepresented students, systematically increasing academic rigor, and creating engaging learning environments for identified students.
