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## **AVID hosts over 2,800 educators at Summer Institute in San Antonio Local teachers part of national effort to close achievement gap**

SAN DIEGO – This summer more than 24,000 educators will be training in AVID strategies. AVID hosted over 2,800 educators in San Antonio, TX at one of nine Summer Institutes entitled *In Pursuit of Success: Dream Big!* on July 15–17. Teachers, counselors, and administrators, primarily from Texas, gathered to learn strategies to improve student engagement, increase graduation rates, and close achievement gaps in underserved student populations. The conference, led by AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) featured local student and teacher speakers discussing how AVID has affected their academic and personal lives, as well as their plans for the future.

Two Texas AVID students, Laurencia Nwankwo from Goose Creek Memorial High School in Baytown, and Quincy Hunt from O.W. Holmes High School in San Antonio, and Sidney Lanier High School AVID teacher Marc Anthony Mendoza inspired a captivated audience with their personal stories about the impact education and AVID have had on their lives.

“It’s clear that if America is to remain an economic power, it needs to have more and more young people reaching and completing higher levels of education,” explained Jim Nelson, Executive Director for AVID Center and former Commissioner of Education in Texas. “Our Summer Institutes offer high-quality professional development that is focused on critical thinking, study and organization skills, and on giving students the support they need to succeed in rigorous coursework.”

San Antonio was one of nine AVID Summer Institute sites across the country including Honolulu, HI; Dallas, TX; Indianapolis, IN; Philadelphia, PA; Orlando, FL; Sacramento and San Diego, CA. More than 24,000 educators from 44 states, as well as Australia, Canada, Virgin Islands, and U.S. Department of Defense Schools, will take part in this year’s Institutes.
